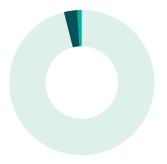

Going the Extra Mile

A Henrico grandmother, who is the legal guardian of her pre-teen grandson, was referred to us to see if she would be eligible for our Home Delivered Meals program. Typically, it takes 1.5 to 2 weeks to fully enroll in the program. However, she had no access to food and was in immediate need. Understanding the urgency, one of our Care Coordinators acted quickly, working with a nonprofit partner to arrange for emergency meals until she was fully enrolled and personally delivered them to her apartment.

While discussing the Home Delivered Meals coordination, the grandmother expressed deep concern that she might not qualify for the program because she didn't have a working stove or microwave to heat the food. Our Care Coordinator reassured her that we would make sure she was taken care of and was able to arrange a microwave for her. After the assessment, Home Delivered Meals were scheduled to start the following week, providing relief and a level of food security for both her and her grandson.
